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INTRODUCTION TO THE SMSP SELECTION PROCESS

Students typically apply to SMSP during their 2nd or 3rd years of study. To apply to the program, students must meet the following criteria:

- Students must have completed 4 Fall/Spring semesters by the time the Program starts in September 2026. Students may apply during their 4th semester
- When the program starts in September 2026, students must be enrolled at their home university
- Once students submit their applications, only those chosen for nomination by the home universities will be reviewed by the SMSP Selection Committee. Only completed applications will be considered

SMSP does not have a minimum required GPA or IELTS/TOEFL exam score; candidates, however, are expected to:

- Be top students with noted intellectual curiosity and a record of accomplishment
- Possess excellent English language competency
- Have outstanding interpersonal skills and be eager to contribute to the class
- Be creative or have other special talents or gifts
- Demonstrate leadership potential
- Be enterprising and demonstrate a spirit of adventure and flexibility

To be a Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Scholar, applicants must successfully complete a highly selective Selection Process comprising three phases: The Application and Nomination Stage, The Finalist Stage, and Selection Days.



PHASE 1: APPLICATION AND NOMINATION STAGE

The SMSP does not accept applications directly from students. Instead, there is a two-step process:

- Interested students submit their completed applications to their designated university administrator via the NYU application system by the specified deadline (please see information below for each university)
- Each of the three universities reviews all of the submitted applications and nominates twenty complete and exceptional applications to the SMSP Office at NYU Abu Dhabi no later than Monday, March 16th, 2026, at 10:00 AM.

NOTE: A nomination is not complete unless all documents are received by the deadline.

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PHASE 2: FINALIST STAGE

The SMSP Selection Committee reviews all nominated applications and selects up to 36 finalists from the 60 nominees. These finalists will be invited to participate in the final stage of the selection process - Selection Days. Finalists will be announced in mid-April 2026.

PHASE 3: SELECTION DAYS

Finalists will be invited to participate in Selection Days - a rigorous national competition during the week of June 1st, 2026. At this event, finalists will undergo a combination of individual and small group interviews with distinguished judges from across the NYU community, a group problem-solving exercise, a writing exercise, and informal interactions with the judges.

Only the most meritorious of the finalists - up to 24 - will be selected as Scholars. The announcement for next year's class of Scholars will be made in the summer. The Program begins in early September 2026.



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APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Students and university administrators must ensure that all applications are complete by the noted deadlines.

NOTE: A nomination is not complete unless all documents are received by the deadline.

Once applications are submitted, university administrators must complete the following by Monday, March 16th, 2026, at 10:00 AM:

1. Review all submitted applications and nominate twenty complete and exceptional applications to the SMSP Office
2. Provide a certification that all twenty students are of good academic standing at the university



1. PERSONAL INFORMATION

Fill out your biographical information on the application, including your contact and address information, academic history, and emergency contact information.

2. STUDENT/PARENT CONSENT FORM

Upload a signed consent form (available for download on the application), certifying the following:

3. CV OR RESUME

Upload your CV or resume, which must include the following sections:

1. Heading

Name, address including P.O. Box (now through August 2026), mobile number, and email address

2. Education

Major(s) and degree(s) obtained (with dates) and sought (with expected date of graduation)

3. Activities

Relevant university co-curricular, extracurricular, and other activities (with dates)

4. Work Experience

Volunteer and/or work experience (with dates)

5. Honors and Awards

Honors, scholarships, awards, publications, leadership accomplishments, and/or creative works (with dates)

6. Other Relevant Skills or Interests

Hobbies, experience with travel abroad, etc.



4. WHY SMSP?

Submit your response to the following: Describe a challenge—local, regional, or global—that you are passionate about addressing. How would participation in the SMSP, with its unique leadership development, cross-cultural exposure, and academic opportunities, equip you to contribute toward addressing that challenge?

In your response, please specify:

- The challenge you wish to address (e.g., environmental sustainability, educational equity, technological access, etc.)
- Your personal connection to this issue (why it matters to you)
- How participation in SMSP—its leadership training, global exposure, or graduate-level advising—would bolster your ability to contribute meaningfully toward this challenge.

Word count: 250 - 300 words

5. PERSONAL ESSAY

Submit your response to the following: Tell us about a moment or experience that sparked your intellectual curiosity. How did this experience change the way you think, and how has it influenced your academic or personal growth?

In your response, please specify:

- The moment, experience, or idea that triggered your curiosity.
- Why was this experience significant, and how did it challenge or deepen your perspective?
- How you pursued this curiosity further (through coursework, research, activities, or personal exploration).
- The impact this curiosity has had on your growth and ambitions.

Word count: 250 - 300 words



6. ACADEMIC PROJECT

What to Submit

Important: Reviewers will focus primarily on your reflective description. Your uploaded work is supporting evidence only.

1. Upload a piece of academic work

- Completed at your university (e.g., essay, report, research project, presentation, portfolio).
- Include grades or feedback if available, but this is optional.

2. Submit a reflective description of your work **(250–300 words)** — *this is the most important part.*

In your reflection, focus on the aspects of your work that best showcase your thinking, learning, and growth. You do not need to cover every detail. A strong reflection typically addresses:

Your Contribution

- Briefly explain the work you did and the approach you took.
- For essays or written work: describe your research, topic selection, argument or analysis, and any challenges you overcame.
- Highlight decisions and skills you applied (e.g., critical thinking, analysis, creativity, problem-solving).

Your Learnings

- What did you learn from completing this work?
- How did it challenge or deepen your understanding of the topic or your skills?

Importance of the Work

- Why was this project meaningful to you?
- How does it reflect your academic interests, growth, or future ambitions?



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7. VIDEO

Upload a video highlighting an aspect of your resume or application that you feel showcases your passions, goals, or accomplishments. This must include video and audio. 60 - 90 seconds.

8. OFFICIAL ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPT

Upload an official and certified transcript that is clear and entirely visible. The transcript must show that you will have completed 4 Fall/Spring semesters by the time the Program starts in September 2026. You may apply during your 4th semester.



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9. TWO FACULTY LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Submit details for two faculty letters of recommendation. The following is an example of the information that will be requested from your faculty. To submit their letter, faculty will receive a link from the NYU application system once you enter their details.

The SMSP is a specially designed program by New York University and New York University Abu Dhabi in conjunction with the Government of Abu Dhabi to offer exceptional university students, in their third or fourth year of a bachelor's program in one of the three national universities in the UAE, an outstanding academic, cross-cultural and leadership development experience. The program offers the following opportunities and benefits:

- One of two academic core courses taught by NYU faculty and instructors. Each course includes an international travel component that enriches and builds upon the topic of the course, leading students to develop global and international perspectives on critical issues of our time.
- What Makes a Leader course
- Public Speaking and Public Presentations course
- Critical Thinking and Persuasive Writing course
- Cross-cultural experiences with students from throughout NYU's Global Network University
- Roundtable meetings with global leaders from around the world
- Advice and counseling on graduate education options and admissions processes

Scholars will be expected to complete all their coursework, including extensive readings, regular essay assignments, class participation, and team projects as assigned. Overall, the work is demanding and rigorous.

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TECHNICAL GUIDE

Welcome to our friendly how-to page to help answer your frequently asked questions about the application and new student process. Below you'll find a guide to the application process (activating your Net ID, accessing your application, and accessing your admissions decision).

How do I log into my application?

Students who begin a multi-step application like SMSP will receive an email titled "[Program Name] Next Steps!" This email will contain your login information for the application login page. You will be provided a temporary PIN to complete the login process. After you have logged in, you will be able to continue your application.

How do I activate my Net ID?

One of the first steps of setting up your account with NYU begins with the instruction of setting up your Net ID. In your "Your NYU ID Numbers and Status Page" communication, you should have received information about your Net ID and N#.

You'll need to activate your NYU NetID and create your password by following the instructions on the [NYU Start Page](#). If your NYU account was activated previously, you may reset your password (if needed) by clicking Reset Password on the [NYU Start Page](#). If you cannot initially activate your credentials, we ask you to try again after 24 hours have passed. Below you'll see a short clip of how to enter your N# and birthdate to activate your Net ID.

Please note: the N# and birthdate entered below are for test purposes only. Your N# should be in the "Your NYU ID Numbers and Status Page" communication, and you should use your real birthdate.

How do I log into my Slate status page?

Logging into your slate status page is easy! Simply login to the [applicant portal](#) using your Net ID and password that you created previously. Once you have logged in, select the application that you wish to review. On your status page, you'll be able to see pending items or if your application is complete. For those who have had their applications reviewed, you will see an update to your application that indicates a decision.
