
As always, we invite you to approach our season with a sense of openness, curiosity, and adventure. Once the lights go on after the performance...what stories will you take with you?





Is an award winning theater writer and director and Artistic Director of *The Walk*. He is a former associate director of the Young Vic (London) and Sundance Theatre Lab alumni. Writing and directing credits include *The Ravine* (Riksteren Theatre, Stockholm) *I am Yusuf and This is my Brother, In the Penal Colony, Alive From Palestine, Oh My Sweet Land* (ShiberHur/Young Vic, London), *The Beloved* (ShiberHur/Bush Theatre, London) *Azza* (European Premiere-Bozar), *West of Us the Sea, Dry Mud* (ShiberHur), and *Against A Hard Surface* (YSDT, Theatre Der Welt, Germany). Directing credits includes: *Samson and Delilah* (Flanders Opera, Antwerp) *Jidarriya* (Edinburgh International Festival, Bouffes du Nord and world tour), *Lanterns Of The King Of Galilee* (Al-Hakawati Theatre), *Taha* (Young Vic), *Comedy of Errors* (Royal Shakespeare Company).

SAMAR HADDAD KING

Artistic/Founding Director of Yaa Samar! Dance Theatre, graduated from the Ailey/Fordham BFA program. Her work has been performed in 13 countries on 4 continents, with commissions throughout the US and abroad including Hubbard Street 2 (Chicago); Palest'In and Out Festival (Paris); Ramallah Contemporary Dance Festival (Ramallah); The Walk/ St. Ann's Warehouse (New York); Good Chance Theatre (Marseille) and others. Awards/Fellowships include: Prix des Jeunes Créateurs Palestiniens pour la Diversité des Expressions Artistiques (Palest'In & Out Festival, Paris); La Fabrique Chaillot Residency (Chaillot - théâtre national de la Danse, Paris); The Center for Ballet and the Arts at NYU and Toulmin Creator (CBA/National Sawdust, NYC); Samar is a 2023 Creative Capital Wild Futures: Art, Culture, Impact awardee. Theater and musical theater credits include *Dead Are My People* (Noor Theatre, NYC), and *We Live in Cairo* (American Repertory Theater, Boston).

JOY CARLOS

Joy received her B.F.A. in Dance from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia. She has performed works by Sidra Bell, J.E. Kim, Curt Haworth, Helen Simoneau, and Iris Bouche. She attended The Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance in Jerusalem, and was a part of a touring ensemble that presented her choreography at Centre National de la Danse (Paris, France) and Royal Conservatoire Antwerp (Antwerp, Belgium). Was born in Qalansawa and graduated from Beit Zvi- School of Acting. She is also a Director of ENTERART, a dance performance project based in Kobe, Japan. Qattan Foundation (2013-16, Belgium); *B* choreographed by Koen Augustijnen and Rosalba Torres (2017-2019, Belgium); *Nomads Dance Camp* directed by Dina Abu Hamdan with choreographers Jorge Crecis, Taoufiq Izzediou, and Samar Haddad King (2014, Jordan); *Naji Ali* with Botega Dance Company directed by Enzo Celli (2009, Italy); and was a champion in *Floor Wars Battle* (2012, Denmark). Mohammed has been a member of YSDT since 2013.

FIDAA ZIDAN

Is a Palestinian actress and writer from the Galilee region of Palestine. She received a B.A. in Social Theater from Haifa University, and a MFA from Tel-Aviv University. Recent performance credits include: *The Walk with Amal* (puppeteer, Turkey, Europe, UK, and New York) and Amir Nizar Zuabi's *Grey Rock* (Remote Theater Project, New York, US and Australia). Zidan has collaborated with Zuabi on several projects including *Against a Hard Surface* (Yaa Samar! Dance Theatre) and *West of Us the Sea*. She wrote and performed in her own production, *The Last Day of Spring*. Additional performances include: *The Stone is Our Sign* and *The Freedom Bus* (The Freedom Theatre); and *Mire*, a musical theater show (Faraj Suliman, Amir Nizar Zuabi). Film credits include: *Polygraph* and *Another Point of View*. Currently Zidan is working on her next solo, (Remote Theater Project) *LINES*, and teaching Spoken Word at the Freedom Theatre Drama School.



RAND TAHA

Is a Palestinian dancer, instructor and programs coordinator from Jerusalem. She earned her BA in Dance at the Jerusalem Academy of Music and Dance, Postgraduate in Copenhagen Contemporary Dance School and Masters degree in Art and Culture Management from Rome Business School. Rand was a member of the Academy's Ensemble for three years and part of the excellence performance program, and won 3rd place in the annual Gertrude Strauss Choreography Competition. She was selected for the Summer Intensive scholarship in Amsterdam at Henny Jurriens Foundation and participated in many workshops in Palestine and Europe with well known dance companies, such as Yaa Samar! Dance Theatre, Akram Khan, Sidi L'arbie Sharqawi, Peeping Tom, Jiry Kylian, and Maurice Causey.
