NYUAD student body boasts unparalleled diversity and caliber.

With less than 5% of applicants admitted to the Liberal Arts curriculum, NYU Abu Dhabi students are both high achieving and enterprising.

Of the varied roster of scholarships, Schwarzman, Erasmus Mundus, and Fulbright to name a few, NYUAD has produced 16 Rhodes Scholars* in just 8 years, more Rhodes Scholars per student than any university in the world.

In addition to our NYU Abu Dhabi undergraduate and graduate student talent pool, our network encompasses students from NYU New York and NYU Shanghai campuses.

*The world's oldest fellowship program, established in 1902, Rhodes Scholarships provide students with two years of postgraduate study at the University of Oxford in England.



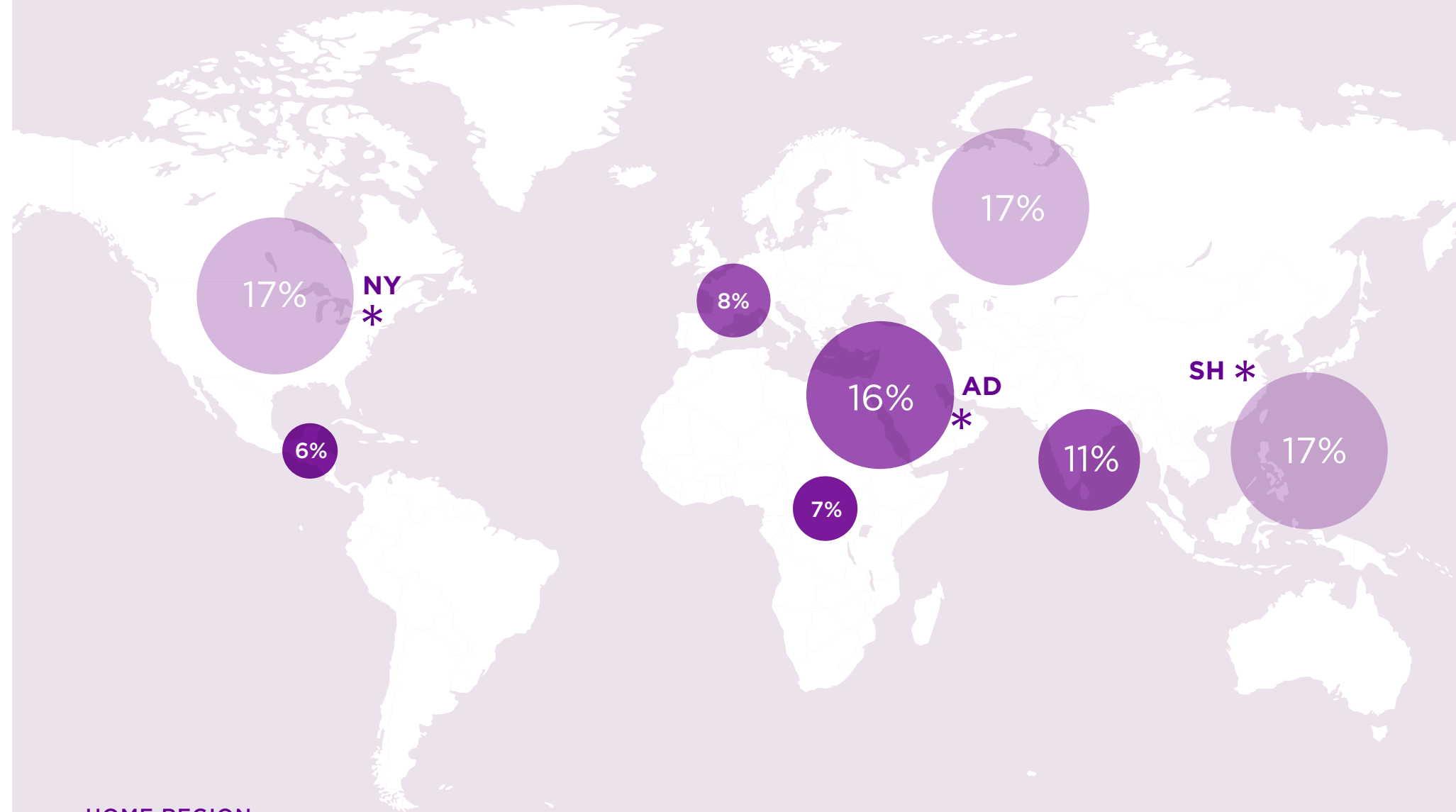
Over 115 languages spoken by students hailing from more than 115 countries.

SUMMER	Mid-May to late August	December-April	Full-time

A

Post a position on Handshake

1. **Create an account** on [Handshake](#), our career services platform.
2. **Post a position** to the platform accessed by more than 30,000 students in the NYUAD, NYUNY and NYUSH.
3. **Keep track of applicants**, search through CVs and more.

On average you may have 15 applications per position.

B

Conduct interviews

1. **Review applicant profiles** on Handshake.
2. **Shortlist candidates** to interview directly on the platform.
3. **Schedule interviews** with shortlisted candidates. Our [Employer Relations Team](#) is on-hand to assist with scheduling large groups of candidates as per your preferred schedule.

C

CV book upon request

Specify concrete requirements (e.g. desired majors, skills, class year) to our Employer Relations Team.

NOTE: CV Books only include students who have previously opted to make their information available. Using CV Books as a primary recruitment strategy will give you access to a smaller pool of candidates.

Students contacted through this process may not be available and/or interested in the position.

Host Information Sessions

1. **Post a session** on [Handshake](#).
These small scale events are usually an hour long and held via ZOOM.
2. **View registered attendees** and make necessary event edits.
3. **Introduce attendees to your organization** (if you are new to our network), your company culture, and current opportunities.

We recommend that recruitment-purpose sessions are held in conjunction with an existing position posted on Handshake.

B

Attend our Career Fairs

1. **Register your organization** for our biannual Opportunities Fairs on Handshake.
2. Post the type of session(s) you will offer:
 - i. **Informational group sessions** (30-minute)
 - ii. **One-on-one meetings** (10-minute each)
3. During the fair, proceed to **shortlist, collect CVs** and **drive candidates** to your job post on Handshake.

1. **RSVP** through our Google Form.
2. **Join the virtual event** on ZOOM.
3. **Grow a community around your organization** with our students, in break-out rooms.
